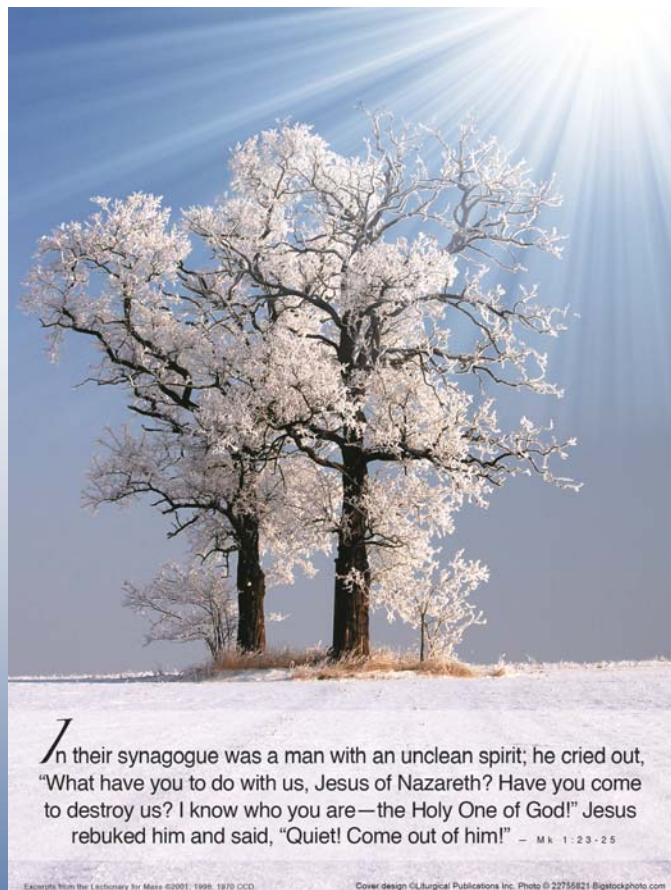

Baptisms

It is recommended to take this class at least 3 months prior to the birth. Your child's Baptismal date will be scheduled upon completion of this class. This is a requirement for your first child and we invite you to attend the class for each child hereafter as a refresher course. It is highly recommended, but not required, for your child's Baptismal Godparents to attend this class with you.

Souper Bowl Weekend of Caring for Harvesters Food Bank

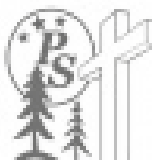

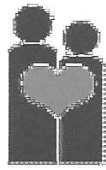
