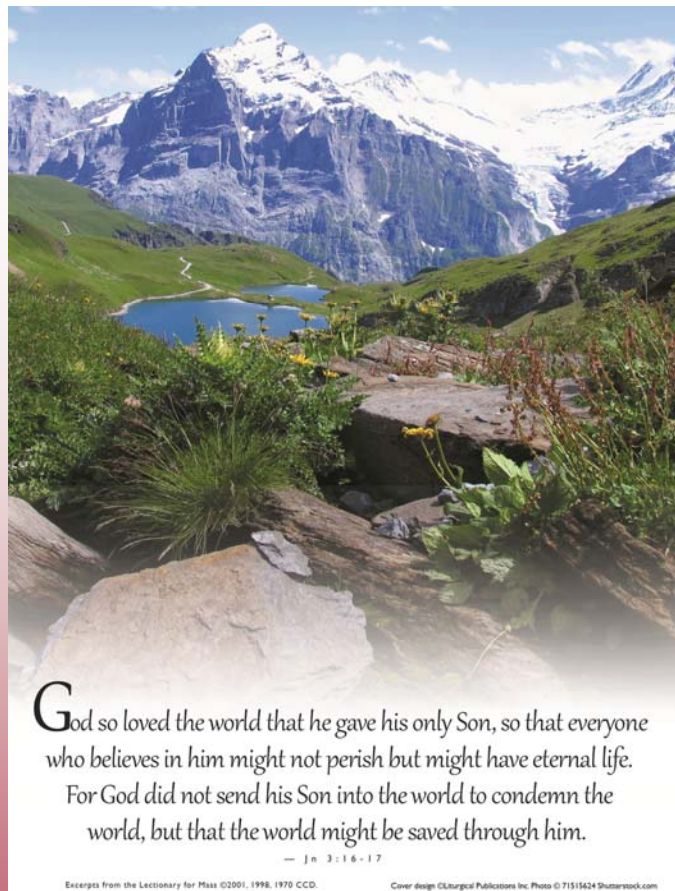

Baptisms

Baptisms are conducted on the first Sunday for each month. Registered parishioners must complete the Baptismal Preparation Class prior to their child's baptism. It is recommended to take this class at least 3 months prior to the birth. To reserve your place in class, please contact Rosalynn Redmond in the Religious Education Office (913) 378-2700, Monday-Thursday from 8:30 a.m. - 12:00 p.m., after hours please leave a message, or send an email to: rosalynn@qhr-opks.org. Your child's Baptismal date will be scheduled upon completion of this class. This is a requirement for your first child and we invite you to attend the class for each child hereafter as a refresher course. It is highly recommended, but not required, for your child's Baptismal Godparents to attend this class with you.

Recently, a proposal was made to the me and the Parish Council to install a flag pole in the church yard near the old bell on the North side of the church. The Parish Council and I approved this project. The flag would be to honor our country, its people, and all those who have served in the military, especially those who lost their lives or were injured. The total cost of the project will be \$1,964.00. We have already had a donation of \$300 toward the cost of the flagpole and will continue to accept donations through July 2011. We would like to install the flag pole in August and have it up and flying for Labor Day. If you are interested in contributing to this project you may drop your check in an envelope in the collection plate and mark it "flag pole" or drop it off at the parish office during the week. Any donations over and above the cost will be given to the Veteran's Hospital in Kansas City, MO for the care of our veterans there.

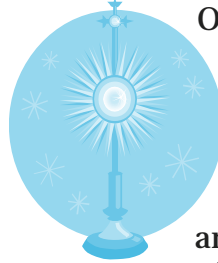
