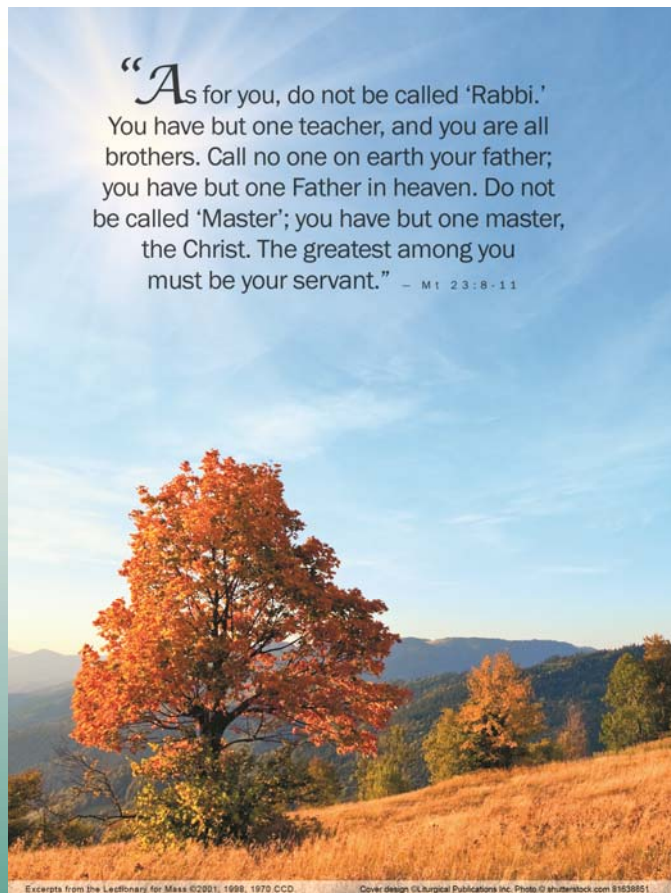

Baptisms

Baptisms are conducted on the first Sunday for each month. Registered parishioners must complete the Baptismal Preparation Class prior to their child's baptism. It is recommended to take this class at least 3 months prior to the birth. To reserve your place in class, please contact Rosalynn Redmond in the Religious Education Office (913) 378-2700, Monday-Thursday from 8:30 a.m. - 12:00 p.m., after hours please leave a message, or send an email to: rosallynn@qhr-opks.org. Your child's Baptismal date will be scheduled upon completion of this class. This is a requirement for your first child and we invite you to attend the class for each child hereafter as a refresher course. It is highly recommended, but not required, for your child's Baptismal Godparents to attend this class with you.

A. Weekly Collection: Every year I like to give you a report on the Financial Condition of the Parish. I can sum up your generosity to the parish from July 2010-June 2011 in five words, Thank You Very, Very Much !! Out of our 1.2 million dollar budgeted, we came out \$5,824 in the black. In these hard economic times thanks for your extra sacrifices to make this possible. Last year we needed \$20,900 weekly to make expenses this year the figure will be \$21,750. We will publish a detailed financial in the bulletin soon. **B. The Leaven:** The Archbishop requests that every household receive a copy of The Leaven each week. The Archdiocese bills each parish for the cost of the subscriptions. The current cost of each annual subscription is \$18, which will be reflected in the envelope next year. With 1,604 households in the parish at \$18 our cost is \$28,872. If you have not had a chance to pay for your subscription, please do so. 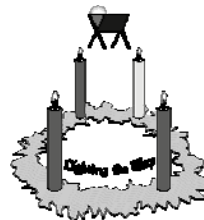

School Information:

The John Paul II middle school religion and social studies classes are busy! The sixth graders have finished a world history unit on the Hebrew Kingdoms and will begin to study the powerful empire of Egypt. In religion the sixth graders are studying the covenant between God and Moses and the Hebrews. We will learn more about the exodus from their slavery in Egypt.

The seventh grade is studying the thirteen colonies as they grow closer to revolution with England. In religion class we will learn about the twelve apostles Jesus picked to start his Church. We will see that we are called by Jesus today to be the disciples called upon to spread "the Word."

What are Catholic men's fellowship groups?

Catholic men's fellowship groups are gatherings of men, usually from the same parish, who get together to discuss their lives in the light of their Catholic faith and to share their faith and experiences through friendship, prayer, and fraternity.

Most groups generally meet for sixty minutes to pray, socialize; discuss their faith and the issues they are grappling with in their lives. They support, affirm, and share insights about the difficulties men encounter in both their home and work lives. They also seek God's help in dealing with the issues they confront every day. Members strive to reinforce Catholic values in their home, reach out to share those values with others in their group, and support other men who are struggling to do the same.

Why join a men's fellowship group?

Most men who have attended a men's fellowship group quickly discover the benefits they offer. Men participating in such groups cultivate friendships among their fellow parishioners, have fun, and learn from one another how to be a better husband, father, son, employee, Christian man, and Catholic parishioner. Many men say they have grown by this experience, which has helped them to form stronger and happier families and to cope better with the stresses they encounter at work. Another reason for belonging to a small group of men is that the men in the group can support each other in their quest for living a Catholic—Christian life (Proverbs 27:17).

It is confusing to be a man today, particularly a Christian man. There is a natural tension between the stereotypical male—the one many of us were taught to be, the male of the media—and the male that God calls men to be. Men are expected to play a variety of roles and to know how to bounce from one role to the other as the wind blows. The man of today is expected to be protective and hard working on the one hand, and gentle and supportive on the other. What is a man to do?
