- Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance is offered every Saturday from 2:30-3:15 pm.

- Baptisms

Baptisms are conducted on the first Sunday for each month. Registered parishioners **must complete the Baptismal Preparation Class prior to their child's baptism.** It is recommended to take this class at least 3 months prior to the birth. To reserve your place in class, please contact Rosalynn Redmond in the Religious Education Office (913)722-2206, Monday-Friday from 9:00 am - 5:00 pm, after hours please leave a message, or send an email to: rosalynn@qhr-opks.org. **Your child's Baptismal date will be scheduled upon completion of this class.** This is a requirement for your first child and we invite you to attend the class for each child hereafter as a refresher course. To share in the beauty and preparation for **this Sacrament, it is highly recommended, but not required, for your child's** Baptismal Godparents to attend this class with you.
