- Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance is offered every Saturday from 2:30-3:15 pm.

- Baptisms

Baptisms are conducted on the first Sunday for each month. Registered parishioners **must complete the Baptismal Preparation Class prior to their child's baptism**. It is recommended to take this class at least 3 months prior to the birth. To reserve your place in class, please contact Rosalynn Redmond in the Religious Education Office (913) 378-2700, Monday-Friday from 9:00 am - 5:00 pm, after hours please leave a message, or send an email to: rosallynn@qhr-opks.org. **Your child's Baptismal date will be scheduled upon completion of this class.** This is a requirement for your first child and we invite you to attend the class for each child hereafter as a refresher course. To share in the beauty and preparation for this Sacrament, it is highly recommended, but not required, for **your child's Baptismal Godparents to attend this class with you.**

The parish staff was walking back and forth throughout the year in all kinds of weather several times a day. The second floor of the rectory where I used to live, was built to house four priests-way too much room for me. The four offices from the convent have been moved to the upstairs of that building and all the staff is now under one roof. The four from the convent are able to work in air conditioning and communication has improved. The church basement has been overbooked with meetings and events. We will move some of these to the convent and make the basement less congested. **I want to thank everyone who helped with this “extreme makeover” for the new residence.** My next article will discuss what offices have been relocated and what meetings will be held in the convent.
